Each class has a minimum requirement enrollment. Once that number is reached the class is a go. If you find a class you like, encourage a friend to join you. Sometimes two or three people can make the difference between a Go or Cancel. So, the word about waiting is DON'T! Register NOW!

#### **REFUND POLICY**

Refunds are allowed under the following circumstances:

1. A student who officially withdraws, in writing, from an occupational extension class prior to the first class meeting or if a class is cancelled shall be eligible for a 100% refund.
2. After class begins, 75% shall be refunded at the request of the student if the student officially withdraws, in writing, from the class prior to or at the 10% point of the scheduled hours of the class. Note: This rule is applicable regardless of the number of times the class meets or the number of hours the class is scheduled to meet.
3. For contact hour classes, students must withdraw, in writing, within 10 calendar days.
4. Self-Supporting classes will refund 75% to the student with an official withdraw from the class prior to the start date. No refunds will be issued after the start date of class.
5. If a student, having paid the required registration fee for a semester, dies during that semester (prior to or on the last day of examinations of the course the student was attending), all registration fees for that semester will be refunded to the estate of the deceased.

## Cosmetology

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### Estheticians

Esthetics is the beautification of the skin, both the face and the body. Become a licensed skin care specialist through Brunswick Community College's Continuing Education's Esthetics Technology program. The Esthetics Technology program includes 600 instructional and clinical hours as required by the N.C. Board of Cosmetic Arts Examiners. In addition to comprehensive lectures, students spend the final 300 hours of the program in practical training. The \$1,170 fee is divided between the first and second semester which includes registration, books, esthetics kit and uniform. Students receive intensive training as skin care therapists. Licensed estheticians work as: Makeup Artists, Cosmetics Buyers, Cosmetic Researchers, Medical Estheticians, and Esthetics Instructors. Class size is limited to 12 students.

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### Manicurist/Nail Technology

This course will focus on developing basic manicuring skills and includes acrylic nail techniques. You will learn acrylic overlay, sculpting methods and free hand nail art. Our goal is to provide comprehensive training and hands-on experience to prepare you to get your license and begin a new exciting career. Students learn the latest procedures in a hands-on, fast paced salon environment and gain valuable experience working with clients, providing a complete range of manicure and pedicure services. This program prepares the graduate for the North Carolina State Board Examination leading to a manicuring license. Additional fee for kit, books and uniform.

This 640 hours course is designed to prepare the student for the certification examination required for the North Carolina licensure application process. Upon successful completion of the course, the student is eligible to sit for the certification exam and apply for state licensure in NC. Additional semester required. 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### Basic Culinary Food Arts Technique I

Upon completion students will have learned basic knife skills, preparation of stocks and leading (mother sauces), and basic cooking techniques. This will included stir-fry, sauté, grilling, pan frying, roasting, steaming, and baking. Plating and presentation as well as table setting and professional customer's service will be incorporated throughout the classes. Students will also receive instruction for ServSafe Food Safety and Sanitation with the opportunity to complete Food handler and or manager certification. \$300 additional fee for food and uniform.

### Wilderness Survivor

This course provides an essential overview of how to survive in wilderness settings. Emphasis is placed on shelter building, locating and purifying water, fire building, identifying wild edibles, trapping, cleaning, and cooking wild game, and basic first-aid. This program qualifies for the NC Environmental Educator Criteria II.

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### Coastal Carolina Heritage: Life and work in the Carolinas

This course will provide a look at our region utilizing historical facts and information as well as local stories, folklore, old photographs, religious traditions, poetry and artifacts to create a sense of time and place. Topics will range from the Scottish immigration of the 1700s to Gullah culture and traditions; from the history of Rosenwald schools to the work of locally born and nationally known poet A. R. Ammons; from travel networks of rivers and railroads to work in the timber industry and the introduction of strawberries to the region; from chicken bogs to smoke houses -- and more. Two of the six classes will include on-site visits.

This course is designed to appeal to life-long residents who want to learn more about their home place as well as those who have moved here and want to get a better sense of their chosen home.

<p><b>Advanced Aquaculture Part I</b></p> <p>This course provides advanced information designed for persons seeking greater and more in-depth knowledge about particular topics in aquaculture including: 1) aquaculture facilities design and construction, 2) fish nutrition, 3) fish genetics and breeding, and 4) diseases and parasites of fish and shellfish. The course is designed to follow our continuing education course called "Introductory Aquaculture", but is open to anybody with a good introductory background in aquaculture. It may be taken in series starting with Intro to Aquaculture, then Advanced Aquaculture, Part 1, and finally Advanced Aquaculture, Part 2. Advanced Aquaculture, Parts 1 and 2 may be taken simultaneously. Both of these courses may also be taken simultaneously with "Introductory Aquaculture". The Basic Rider Course<sup>SM</sup> is a 22 hour course and is aimed at beginning riders of all ages. It is also a great course to reintroduce yourself to riding if you are re-entering motorcycling after not riding for a few years.

The course consists of classroom and range/riding time. Practical riding skills are developed in a controlled, off-street environment. The course is mandatory for motorcyclists under the age of 18 in the state of NC. Also, participants under the age of 18 must have a release form from both their School and their parent/legal guardian in order to take this course. Participants must attend all sessions fully to get credit for the class. Graduates of the course will receive a waiver card for the NCDMV. This waiver card provides an NCDMV endorsement on your license without having to take the NCDMV riding test. You will still have to pass the NCDMV written exam and vision exam in order to get your full endorsement. Graduates will also receive a completion card. This card could potentially qualify you for discounts on your insurance.
