

CHAPTER 4 STUDENT SERVICES

4.22 GRADUATION ELIGIBILITY

POLICY

To be eligible for graduation in an associate degree, diploma, or certificate program, students must have taken at least one-fourth of the total number of credit hours required in his/her program of study at BCC, and maintain a minimum of a 2.0 GPA in his/her program of study. There are no exceptions.

PROCEDURES

To apply for graduation from a degree, diploma, or certificate program, the student must:

- Complete an "Application for Graduation" for each graduating term, regardless of the student's intent to participate in the actual ceremony. *Note: students may apply to graduate from multiple programs of study in the same term on one application;*
- Attach a program evaluation showing "Pending Anticipated Complete;"
- Submit a completed application by September 15 (fall graduates) or February 10 (spring and summer graduates);

To be eligible for graduation from a degree, diploma, or certificate program, the student must:

- Pass all courses required in the student's chosen program of study;
- Earn a minimum, cumulative grade point average of 2.0 in the program of study;
- Satisfactorily complete at least one-fourth of the total number of credit hours for the program of study at Brunswick Community College;
- Meet all other additional requirements for graduation from the college (i.e. an Early College High school graduate must provide a final high school transcript showing their "actual" high school graduation date before his/her college credential may be awarded);

In addition to the above requirements, certain programs of study have clock-hour, state examination, and/or minimum grade requirements for a student to be eligible for graduation from the program of study. See specific department level documents for those requirements.
