PHLEBOTOMY

This 216-hour class leads to National Certification as a Phlebotomy technician. This course provides anatomy & physiology, safety, universal precautions, infection control, emphasis on ethics, health care delivery systems, legalities, medical terminology, patient relations, documentation, instruction in proper blood collection and other specimens used for diagnostic testing. Upon course completion, students should be able to safely perform procedures necessary for specimen collection and may be eligible for national certification as Phlebotomy technicians. CPR and First Aid scheduled during class hours; AHA BLS Certification.

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Health Records/Background Check

Must be turned in to Instructor within the first two weeks of class. *NO EXCEPTIONS.*

- COVID-19: Clinical are required to successfully complete the course, clinicals are required. All of our clinical partners require COVID vaccination. Please upload proof of vaccination or medical/religious waiver to Castlebranch within the first two weeks of class.
- Background Check & Drug screen done through Castle Branch (See information sheet for collection and input of records)
- Physical Exam & Health History within the past year
- Hepatitis B Vaccine (First Dose & 2nd) Hepatitis Booster or 3rd dose due 6 months from 1st injection or signed declination statement.
- Tetanus (must be T-DAP) within 10 years
- TB two step Skin Test annually 1st one initial dose, then wait one week and repeat TB test
- MMR (2doses) Only one dose is needed if born before 1957
- Varicella Titer (only if you HAVE HAD the chicken pox) otherwise must have Varicella vaccine
- Two doses of Varicella Vaccine (if you HAVE NOT had chicken pox)
- Flu Vaccine if registering for a class that takes place between October through March
