"At BCC, we believe every student deserves the opportunity to thrive academically, regardless of the challenges that life may throw their way. The Foundation created Emergency Scholarships for this reason. We thank Mr. Fravel for his thoughtfulness and generosity."

Nelson explained that the Foundation closely manages all Emergency Scholarship payments. "Rather than dispensing cash, we pay bills directly to vendors," said Nelson. "Even if it means going with a student to fill a gas tank or purchase a book, we work with them every step of the way to ensure they have what they need to get back on track."

How to Help

While it all too often goes unnoticed, one of the most costly unexpected hardships is being without enough funds for food. For that reason, BCC established a food pantry open to students. Whether it's a snack, dinner, or a week's worth of meals, the pantry is available to those who need it.

Housed on the first floor of Building A on the main campus, the food pantry offers ready-to-eat and non-perishable items, as well as feminine hygiene products and basic toiletries.

The Food Pantry does not require any documentation of need. It operates on the honor system. Shoppers will be asked to sign in upon entering in an effort to continually improve our offerings.
