








Ambassador Spotlight: Meet Miley Ritchie

BCC President Gene Smith, joined by VP of Continuing Education and Economic & Workforce Development Greg Bland and The Foundation of BCC Executive Director Teresa Nelson, accepted the donation during a recent visit with MicroSolv President Bill Ciccone.

"This donation is the culmination of a long-term partnership between BCC and MicroSolv Technology Corporation," said VP Bland. "This relationship has included customized training in forklift operations, fire prevention, facility evacuation, CNC logic, and programming. This most recent donation will provide workforce development scholarships to students seeking opportunities to retrain, retool, and learn a new skill."

An HPLC Columns and Chromatography Accessories manufacturer, MicroSolv is a privately held company based in the USA. They acquire, develop, and manufacture different technologies such as Cogent TYPE-C™ HPLC columns, RSA™ autosampler vials, pharmaceutical grade syringe filters, HPLC fittings, other types of chromatography accessories and supplies, including stainless steel frits and filters, and many other tools for the Separation Sciences. The corporation is located in the Industrial Park in Leland, near BCC's Leland Center.

"It was an honor meeting Mr. Ciccone and learning about MicroSolv," said Nelson. "His dedication to supporting community colleges and serving Leland and surrounding areas was evident in mere minutes. We are grateful for his support of our students and look forward to working together for many years."






